HONDURAS MISSION TRIP 2016 – POPHAM TEAM

Praise God for what He did in Monquecagua, Intibuca, Honduras during our recent Mission Trip, July 23-30, 2016. Our mission team included a total of 23 people from Kentucky, Alabama, and Mississippi. Two workers from the Good Shepherd Christian Academy joined us, as well as Pastor Gervacio Figueroa (the pastor of Transformation Baptist Church, LaEsperanza) and six members of their church. We were under the supervision of Baptist Medical & Dental Mission International Missionary, Rene Pizzati.

How glorious it was for 278 people to accept Jesus as Savior! 118 professions of faith were made during the Evangelistic Services; 46 were made during Children's Church; 45 were from Street Evangelism; 68 were from the Veterinary Ministry; and one was from the "Valley of Angels" on shopping day.

The Medical Clinic treated 2,457 patients (1,538 were female; 919 were male). The clinic also gave away approximately 900 bags of beans totaling over \$3,200. Approximately 90 patients received physical therapy in the clinic.

Three people were referred to the Project Life program. We were also able to provide a wheelchair for one patient and a walker for another.

The Pharmacy dispensed 10,772 prescriptions. Each family received toiletries, toothbrushes, tracts, etc. in their bags.

The Optical Clinic dispensed 106 pairs of prescription eyeglasses and 391 readers and sunglasses for a total of 497 eyeglasses.

The Dental Clinic treated 247 patients and extracted 372 teeth. They gave away dental instructions, toothpaste, and toothbrushes.

There were nine sessions of Children's Church for a total of 1,016 children (average attendance of 113 per session). Missionary Marina Calderon assisted our team with her excellent leadership.

There were 24 boxes of shoes and 56 boxes of clothing given out in the Shoe and Clothing Ministries. Over 2,000 people received clothing and approximately 800 received shoes or flip-flops.

The Veterinary Ministry treated 209 cows, 13 horses, 37 hogs, four sheep, and one

We distributed 48 New Testaments, approximately 1,000 complete Bibles, 100 Gideon Bibles, 300 New Believer's Books, 3,200 John/Romans, and approximately 300 salvation dolls. Some of the Bibles were left for local churches and others to distribute. The evangelism team also distributed medicine packs.

The kitchen crew made sure we all (including the missionaries, national staff, translators, guards, and others) were well fed. Victor kept the compound running!!

Page 1 - Part D – MISSION STATEMENT

Believing that the Christian life is one of discovery and growth - asking and receiving, seeking and finding, knocking and having doors opened, we as a body of believers accept these challenges as our mission: Spread the gospel of Christ; minister to church family and community, not only spiritually, but also physically and emotionally; teach and live Christian values and ethics; promote worship and fellowship among church family and community. Change to:

to God with an open heart and faithful obedience in response to His call **REACHING IN...**

to our church fellowship to grow and serve together in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ

Page 1 – Part F – AMENDMENTS

Any proposed amendment must be presented to the church in writing at a regular <u>or called</u> business meeting and shall be called to the attention of the church membership by a church-wide mail-out. This Constitution and By -Laws may then be amended by a simple majority of those active members present and voting at the next regular <u>or called</u> business meeting.

Page 3 – ARTICLE II – CHURCH STAFF – SECTION 1. PASTOR – A. CALLING

A. Pastoral Search Committee shall be formed and shall consist of five (5) active members. The active Deacons will accept nominations for this committee from the church and the nominees will be presented during a regular or called business meeting for a vote. The committee will consist of the five nominees receiving the highest number of votes. An additional vote will be taken in the event of a tie.

Page 4 – C. INVOLUNTARY TERMINATION – 1a.

a. Any two people person or group wishing to call for a vote of dismissal of the Pastor shall first counsel with the active Deacons concerning reason(s) for termination; then, a petition requesting the Pastor's termination must be signed by 30% of the active membership of the church.
