LINDA'S LINES

The season of Lent begins this very week. Ash Wednesday, the first day of this season, is February 17. Ash Wednesday gets its name from the Bible times when "sackcloth and ashes" were symbols of repentance and purification. It is common among some traditions to use ashes and to make the sign of the cross on the forehead for those who wish to publicly show their repentance. Ashes are a symbol of humility before God; they are a sign of God's grace for the penitent. Ashes remind us of resurrection. Our bodies will turn to ashes in the grave, but we look forward to the new bodies which God will give us.

In early days Lent was a time of preparation of candidates for baptism on Easter Sunday in which these candidates prepared for this initiation into the Christian life. Lent for us is a time of preparation, prayer, discipline, reflection, repentance, self-denial, sacrifice, and service. It is a time for remembering Christ's sacrifice. There are 40 weekdays in the season of Lent, which symbolize the 40-day fasts of Moses, Elijah, and Jesus. The holy season of Lent concludes with Holy Week. Holy Week is a time of reflection upon the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. Holy Week leads us to the joyous and glorious season of Easter. May this season of Lent be one in which we all grow closer to Jesus through sacrifice and devotion!

This year's Holy Week theme will be "Journey with Jesus". We will reflect upon the journey to the cross and beyond the cross. Thanks in advance for those of you who will volunteer to write devotionals for this week. We will be offering additional worship services and events, as well.

During the Lenten season the sermons will focus on Jesus' journey during the last month of His life on earth. This coming Sunday we will focus on when Jesus raised Lazarus from the grave. Let's remember Jesus' poignant words in this narrative: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do vou believe this?" We must all answer the question: Do vou believe?

IT'S COLD OUT THERE

In one episode of the Andy Griffith Show, Sheriff Taylor and Floyd the barber were having a conversation that went something like this:

Sheriff Taylor: "Well, as Mark Twain said, everybody complains about the weather, but nobody does anything about it."

Floyd: "Did he say that?"

Sheriff Taylor: "Mm-hmmm."

Floyd: "I thought Calvin Coolidge said that."

Sheriff Taylor: "No, no Floyd, Calvin Coolidge didn't say that."

Floyd: (after a pause) "What'd Calvin Coolidge say?" [laughter]

The weather is something we talk about every day, especially this time of year. We might even complain about the "weather man" when he misses the forecast. It does seem like forecasting snow and ice can be especially hard. Still, it is amazing (to me, anyway) that scientists and weather forecasters do as well as they do. After all, they are only human.

Job 1:1 describes Job as a blameless and upright man who "feared God and shunned evil." Still, this righteous man, living in a fallen world, had to deal with the idea of bad things happening to good people. God spoke to Job in the last three chapters of the book, often asking rhetorical questions that had something to do with creation—with science, if you will.

"From whose womb has come the ice? And the frost of heaven, who has given it birth?" asked God of Job in 38:29. God was reminding Job that He is The Creator and Sustainer of life. He alone has the ultimate understand of all things.

You and I live with the various branches of science everyday whether we think about it or not. The recent winter storms that have interrupted our lives are an annual occurrence. The Covid-19 pandemic, in contrast, is perhaps something that may happen only once a century or so.

Like Mark Twain, we complain about the weather, but have to admit that only God can do something about it. Like Job, we take our complaint directly to God concerning pandemics realizing He alone has the answers.

It is a blessing to work with the FCBC staff and volunteers during this time of uncertainty. We are planning ahead with the humble realization that only God truly has control of the future. Please join us in praying for "normal" to return soon. Maybe this is a time for us, like Job, to be reminded that God is ultimately in control of all things.
