Please pray for the Nicaragua Mission Team as we travel soon to minister mainly to the children in the Emmanuel Home for Protection. We will fly to Managua, Nicaragua on January 23 and return to Louisville on January 29. The Emmanuel Home of Protection is a part of Baptist Medical and Dental Mission International and is located in the small town of Diriamba, Nicaragua, just thirty minutes south of the capital city of Managua. It is supervised by missionaries Karl and Beth Brassfield. The Emmanuel Home for Protection cares for girls mostly eighteen and under who have been subjected to abuse. Many of the girls still have families, but have been removed from their families because of the abuse received. The goal of this ministry is to provide a secure and loving environment for these girls and to minister to them spiritually, emotionally, and physically with the love of Christ. Our team will be partnering with the Brassfields to do just that. Please pray for the team members: Kim and Rachel Been, Renee Bryant, Lyndsey Emert, Sam and Becky Frizzell, Linda Popham, Barbara Ruedel, Joy Stelly, and Ed and Betty Ward. YOUTH AND CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Chris McWhorter - Minister of Youth and Children

As the once distant 2016 made its way to present, I was reminded of an illustration I want to share with you.

Every year thousands travel by cruise ships through the Inside Passage of Alaska stopping at the old gold rush town of Nome. For those fortunate enough to visit during the winter months, they are met by an amazing spectacle. Neither words, nor pictures, can truly describe the beauty that is seen. As the snow blankets everything that it touches, objects are transformed by the snow into pristine, timeless, captivating forms. Some even venture to say that it is "Heaven's touch on Earth!"

However, for those tourists who visit during the summer, they are met with a huge disappointment. What was once beautiful and near magical has been revealed for what it truly is. Due to the harsh winters, permafrost, and limited landfill area, litter is left in front of many houses. Wrecked cars and broken down snowmobiles sit and rust on grassless front yards. Abandoned appliances, outgrown toys, and assorted refuse contribute to the unsightly landscape until the winter snows blanket them again. The melted snow revealed what was hidden underneath.

Many of us are like this illustration. We tend to hide the hurt, disappointments, pain, the broken relationships, our inadequacies, frustrations, addictions, shortcomings, and failures under a façade. We walk into a room with great big smiles but hidden underneath the mask is something that's so much different. When the cover is removed, it reveals what is hidden underneath.

Luke 8:17 reads: For everything that is hidden or secret will eventually be brought to light and made plain to all.

Sounds scary, does it not? Man, we don't want the light to reveal what is hidden in our lives. We don't want certain parts of our lives to be exposed. What would people think? What would people think if they could see the real you, the part of you that is covered up? What would God think? Fear, worry, and anxiety are probably just a few of the emotions that would flood your mind. Thankfully, this passage is not talking about embarrassing us, or hurting us, or exposing us for who we really are. This passage was written, rather, to reveal something very important to us. This is something that was once hidden, but has been revealed to us. Jesus was talking to His disciples and others in parables, and many didn't understand what was being said. It wasn't until later that the disciples understood what Jesus was telling them.

Romans 16:26 – But now as the prophets foretold and as the eternal God has commanded, this message is made known to all Gentiles everywhere, so that they might believe and obey Christ.

What message was made known? Romans 10:8-11 Salvation that comes from trusting Christ - which is the message we preach - is already within easy reach. In fact, the Scriptures say, "The message is close at hand; it is on your lips and in your heart. For if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved. As the Scriptures tell us, Anyone who believes in him will not be disappointed."

What was once secret was brought to light for us to understand. The truth isn't buried or mistaken for something it is not. It doesn't have to be covered up or hidden. The truth is for us to see and understand. Only Jesus Christ can change us and transform us into whom He destined us to be. What this means is that those who become Christians become new persons. They are not the same anymore, for the old life is gone. A new life has begun! (II Corinthians 5:17)

As the new year ticks on, how will this message impact you? Would you be willing to be transformed by the saving power of Jesus Christ? Make it a resolution this year to start out on the right foot and put Jesus Christ first in your life.


