Many of us that are of a certain age will remember the gospel hymn refrain above. The hymn text is written as if a person needing to hear the gospel message is making a plea such as this in the second stanza: "Tell me the story slowly, / That I may take it in- / That wonderful redemption, / God's remedy for sin." Then, the refrain issues its petition as each repetitive statement, "Tell me the old, old story," seems to add to the urgency. The gospel of Jesus Christ truly is God's remedy for sin!

Are you and I telling the old, old story? Right now, we are participating with Kentucky Baptist Churches in an effort called "The Gospel to Every Home." That title should need no explanation. We are to pray for and actively participate in taking the good news of "Jesus and His love" to every home.

I believe there is no better time than Holy Week and Easter to do that. People are more open to an invitation to come to church—to come to Jesus—during this time than any other time of the year. And even though we are still in the pandemic, things are improving somewhat and people are getting out more and more. Plus, for those who are uncomfortable attending in person in the building, technology is allowing us to share God's message of redemption through old and new methods.

So, what do we need to do? Here are suggestions.

- Get engaged. Listen to that "call-em-all" from Pastor Linda...even if you think you know exactly what she is going to say.
- Act on what she and others are sharing through the phone messages or other means.
- Get excited! In I Corinthians 15 Paul reminds the church that the gospel should always be our focus and should draw us together. "Death has been swallowed up in victory" (verse 54b) is the best news anyone could hear! That is the news of the old, old story.
- Share the good news with others. Walk next door or meet your neighbor over the fence. Forward a link to our services by email or in your social media. These things include (but not limited to):
 - ♦ Sunday morning and Holy Week services.
 - ♦ Monday Messages.
 - ♦ Karen's "Peaceful Piano Praises."

It is Holy Week! It is Easter! Let us join together to tell the old, old story of Jesus and His love!
