This letter to the church in the important city of Corinth is sort of a corrective for the believers there. Just a few verses into the book the Apostle sternly warns them about divisions within their congregation. As his letter continues he addresses other problems within the church and at times gets pretty specific!

But, as Paul always does, he turns the focus to the message of the gospel and challenges the church to focus on that Good News, as well.
