Music Notes

Steve Skaggs - Interim Minister of Music

In my experience through the years, church people have not been shy in expressing their views on the use of music in worship. Complaints are especially memorable and usually have to do with musical style or the subject of the text. "I don't like to sing sad songs" is one universal protest I have heard. But is that a legitimate request? Should we avoid sad songs in corporate worship?

Psalm 137 describes the mood of God's people upon being taken captive by their enemies and led to a foreign country. The text says they sat and wept by the rivers of Babylon. They refused to sing the joyful songs of worship they had employed in the temple on Mount Zion.

So what did they sing? Perhaps a song of lament such as Psalm 60. To lament is to express deep sorrow, grief, or regret. Thus a song or psalm of lament is a prayer that may allow the believer to share a particular struggle that an individual or a group of believers is encountering. Let's take a look at Psalm 60.

You have rejected us, O God, and burst forth upon us; you have been angry--now restore us!
You have shaken the land and torn it open; mend its fractures, for it is quaking.

In these first two verses we see this is meant to be sung by a group of worshipers ("we"). The complaint is stated by the group who feels judged or abandoned by God.

On down in verse five a petition is stated: "Save us and help us with your right hand, that those you love may be delivered." The final two verses continue the request for help and acknowledge that God is the only source of victory.

The following psalm, Psalm 61, is a personal lament. "Hear my cry, O God; listen to my prayer" it begins. It, too, issues a complaint and a confession of faith and concludes with praise: "Then will I ever sing praise to your name and fulfill my vows day after day."

During this pandemic we will continue to sing songs that remind us of God's promises that never fail. We will sing "Victory in Jesus" with great joy! But we'll also sing songs that remind us that we need to cry out to God in confession and plead for deliverance. We need to lament.

Just as I am, without one plea,
But that Thy blood was shed for me,
And that Thou bidd'st me come to Thee,
O Lamb of God, I come! I come!
