#### STAY CONNECTED

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:24-15, NIV

The above verses are quite familiar. We preachers reference them when we want to remind you that the Bible says we should not be skipping out on attending church. God tells us that we Christians should stay connected.

But what about this year--the year of a scary international pandemic? Do these verses still apply? Our government officials, acting on the advice of scientists and health experts, ask us to limit the size and nature of our gatherings.
